\* These courses are prerequisites to the college of education and include the elementary distributed minor. Students must have a minimum of 2.7 GPA in these classes, and their major. Classes must be completed prior to applying to the College of Education. **Consult with your advisor!**

<sup>1</sup> Students must take one course of the following: ECO 210, 211, HST 203, 204, 205, 206, PLS 102, SOC 280 or GPY 235 (HST 203 is recommended because of the Basic Skills Test).

<sup>2</sup> Students who pass out of WRT 305 have room to take a GenEd/Theme course in this semester.

<sup>3</sup> Starting Fall 2003, CHM 219 is changed to SCI 319.

<sup>4</sup> SCI 380 will be renumbered to SCI 495 starting Fall 2004.

<sup>5</sup> Choose one of the following classes as your elective: WRT 219 - Introduction to Creative Writing; ENG 309 - Teaching Literature to Children; ENG 310 - Teaching Writing, or any foreign language course.

### Special Notes:

- This is a **general** curriculum guide and will not work for everyone, especially those students who have AP or CLEP credit.
- Courses that have (*Gen Ed*) written after them are classes that are required in the major and also fulfill a section of the general education program.
- Remember to fulfill your 2 SWS requirements; 1 can be taken in the gen ed program and 1 in your major.
- Some classes are in multiple sections within the gen ed. If you take a course that can be counted in two categories, you can open up 1-2 more spots for major electives.
- You must have **120 credits** to graduate from Grand Valley State University.
