

# PAUL B. HENRY

## CONGRESSIONAL INTERNSHIP

The GVSU Department of Political Science is now taking applications for the Henry Internship competition. The Henry Internship places a GVSU student – the “Henry Scholar” – in the Washington, D.C., offices of one of Michigan’s Representatives or Senators during the spring/summer 2009 session. The Paul B. Henry Foundation pays a stipend of \$2,000 to defray the costs of travel and living expenses, and Scholars receive a tuition waiver for up to 6 credits.

**ELIGIBILITY:** To be eligible, students must have completed a minimum of 55 credits by the end of this semester (Winter 2009) and are expected to report about their experiences to the GVSU community during the 2009/10 academic year.

**APPLICATION PROCEDURE:** Please submit a resume, transcript, one recommendation letter, and an essay of up to 750 words that addresses your reasons for seeking the internship, how your past experiences prepare you for it, and how it will help you advance your professional goals. Students may identify a legislator with whom they would prefer to work, but keep in mind that placement with that legislator is not guaranteed.
