

Ghana: Honors Cultural Exchange & Service Learning

WINNEBA & ACCRA, GHANA — This program offers students the distinctive service-learning experience to learn about a fascinating culture through the holistic combination of the classroom, service-learning placements, and a wide spectrum of experiences in Ghana, Africa.

During the first week, students stay at the University of Ghana in Accra for the first segment of a social science course to learn about nongovernmental organizations (NGOs). Students then travel to the coastal village of Winneba to begin their five-week service learning course component. For this service learning component, students can work with governmental and non-governmental organizations that focus on health, education, human-trafficking, and issues concerning potable water.
