University Admission Requirements

- 1. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution of higher education
- 2. Submission of all required admission materials, including:
 - a. Completed graduate application for admission
 - b. \$30 nonrefundable application fee (unless you have previously applied to Grand Valley)
 - c. <u>Official transcripts</u> from all institutions of higher education previously attended. Transcripts must be sent from those institutions directly to the GVSU Admissions Office. *NOTE: We do not require official transcripts from Grand Valley*
 - d. For applicants whose native language is NOT English. Test scores from the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language), or IELTS (International English Language Testing System), or MELAB (Michigan English Language Assessment Battery).

MPH Program Admission Requirements

In addition to the University requirements of admission, all students seeking a degree for the Master of Public Health (MPH) must also meet the following requirements:

- 1. Minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA
- 2. Recommendations: <u>Two recommendations</u> received. You can provide the emails of three references in your account at www.gvsu.edu/gradapply, and they will be sent a link to fill out for their online recommendation
- 3. <u>Essay/Personal Statement</u>: All applicants must provide a written statement that addresses both of the following questions. The overall response should not exceed two, double-spaced pages (maximum).
 - a. What would make you an excellent candidate for the Grand Valley State University MPH program?
 - b. What are your expectations for a future career in Public Health (highlighting your emphasis area of interest)?
- 4. The Admissions committee reserves the right to require additional information or action it deems appropriate, including GRE test scores, or requiring applicants to appear for an oral interview.
