The September German national elections opened the door for Angela Merkel's fourth term as Chancellor, but also saw a Far-right party, the Alternative for Germany, win seats in the federal legislature for the first time since the end of the Second World War. Difficulties forming a new governing coalition raise important questions not only about the future of German politics and policy, but also about the impact of the political crisis on the EU and German-American relations. Join us for a discussion with this distinguished German expert.



Nico Lange is the director of the Washington office of Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung with responsibility for the USA and Canada. Before moving to the U.S., Lange was deputy director for political consulting and head of domestic policy at the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung headquarters in Berlin, Germany. In this role, he provided policy-oriented research and political advice to top-level politicians in the German government and to the Merkel-led CDU/CSU parliamentary group.
