Legal and Bioethical Dilemmas Regarding Surrogacy

In the last thirty years, the desire to become a parent has been achieved in many cases through surrogacy, a phenomenon that has become a heated issue of law and bioethics. My talk will describe the complex problems arising in Italy and Michigan from the current legal framework, and I will offer my recommendations for a solution.
