- b. Senator Resignations
 - I do have some unfortunate news. Senators Burns, James, Maiuri, Martinez, TerHorst, and Werner, and Vice President Johnson IV are not returning to Student Senate this semester for various reasons.

e. The First Four Weeks

- i. We are going to be sprinting through January with a lot of dense, but really important topics.
- ii. Today, we will be discussing the governing docs, interviewing our applicants, and setting up the Elections Commission.
- iii. Next week, we will be appointing all of our new members, ratifying the new Constitution and Bylaws, and discussing rules for the elections.
- iv. We have our big State of the Student Senate address on January 25th where President Mantella will sign our new Constitution.
- v. We will be holding our semesterly inservice on February 1st, just like the one you all attended when you got appointed last semester. We will approve the rules for the elections at this meeting, and it will also be the first time you may present legislation to the General Assembly. More on legislation in a bit.

f. Policy Priorities

- i. I have a few issues I want to prioritize for discussion, including admissions and retention, public safety, infrastructure, and mental health.
- ii. Admissions and retention is priority number uno for me.

g. Elections

- i. If you are planning on running for re-election, here is your timeline:
- ii. We will begin circulating petitions to get on the ballot on February 5th.
- iii. These petitions will be due on February 29th.
- iv. Voting will begin on March 18th, and we'll have the results for you on April 2nd.
- v. From there, the newly elected General Assembly will meet on April 4th and April 11th to conduct Cabinet elections.
- vi. So as you can see the election is right around the corner, so if you haven't already, it would be a good idea to start thinking about your plans for next year as far as Senate goes.

h. Events

 We've got several big events this semester including Campus Life Night which is tomorrow. We've also got State of the Student Senate, Presidents' Ball, Elect Her, Last Lecture, the General Election, and Exam Cram. We also have Student Senate Week to promote running for Student Senate to the student body. More on these events as we get closer.

i. What's different this semester?

- i. First off, Cabinet voted to strike the office hours requirement at our last Cabinet meeting. The expectation is that you all are still helping out, and we are reserving the right to reinstate office hours if we feel like it's not going well.
- ii. We will still be giving out stipends for this semester. Just a reminder that the stipends are a temporary measure for just this year due to our restructuring process. General Senators will not be receiving stipends going forward. Cabinet's main concern with striking office hours was that we are still handing out stipends, so this semester, instead of meeting a minimum set of requirements to earn them, we will be expecting you to go above and beyond to receive these, so please keep that in mind throughout this semester.

Now that all of you have some experience under your belt, I am expecting you to speak up more often on discussion points. Our job is to represent students, and it is very important that we are making our voices heard.
