- In just two years after finishing your undergraduate degree, you can earn a Master of Science in Anesthesia at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU). They offer instruction in **Cleveland, Ohio**, and at their off-site location in **Houston, Texas**. They are pleased to announce their intention to create a **Washington, D.C.** program; they have applied for the necessary approvals and accreditations. Each location provides unique opportunities in learning. **They are now accepting applications for all locations. The application deadline is October 1 for admission in June 2012.** Anesthesiologist assistants (AAs) are mid-level anesthesia care providers working within the Anesthesia Care Team under the supervision of anesthesiologists. Starting salaries are determined by regional factors but are approximately \$120,000 per year. For the past 16 years 100% of CWRU's AA students who were actively seeking employment have had job offers before graduation. The Master of Science in Anesthesia Program at CWRU offers shadowing experiences for interested students. Why Enroll in a Post Baccalaureate Program?
There are many reasons to enroll in a Post Baccalaureate Premedical Program (often called *PostBac* program for short). Some are designed for career changers; some are geared to students who need to complete coursework in requisite undergraduate science courses; other programs focus on those applicants who would like to improve their GPA's. Another group of programs are specifically designed to assist persons from groups underrepresented in medicine or from educationally or economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

- **Columbia University Postbac Premed Program**

The Columbia University Postbaccalaureate Premedical Program affords students great flexibility, with the option to enroll full- or part-time and opportunities to begin study in the fall, spring, or summer. For those who are up for a challenge and wish to enroll in the spring, the Accelerated Program will allow students to complete their premedical coursework in 18 months. As the oldest and largest program of its kind, the Columbia University Postbac Premed Program is highly regarded for its rigorous approach to medical school preparation.
