

- **Summer Medical and Dental Education Program.** SMDEP is a **FREE six-week summer** academic enrichment program for **freshman and sophomore** college students who are interested in a career in **medicine or dentistry**. SMDEP is implemented at **12 sites** across the **nation** and participants engage in stimulating courses in the basic sciences and quantitative topics, shadow dentists and physicians to observe patient care, learn about the application process, and participate in financial planning and health policy workshops. SMDEP is focused on building a **diverse dental and medical workforce across the nation**. Since the program began in 1987, **over 19,000 students have participated in the program**. The application cycle for the 2013 summer program opened November 1, 2012 and the deadline is **March 1, 2013**. To learn more about the program visit www.smdep.org.
- **The Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine Summer Scholars Program.** The Summer Scholars program is a tremendous academic experience for **underrepresented or educationally or economically disadvantaged students** to grow personally and be challenged professionally on the OU-HCOM campus. The program replicates what will be experienced in the first year of medical school. Courses, taught by OU-HCOM faculty, include gross anatomy (with cadaver dissection), histology, immunology, biochemistry, integrated biomedical sciences, an introduction to case based learning (CBL), and workshops dealing with the admission process, time management and many other experiences relevant to the medical school experience. The Summer Scholars Program is **six weeks in length** and includes room and board, a living allowance, travel expenses, and the potential for a guaranteed interview for the entering class at the medical school. Detailed

information, eligibility requirements, and application materials can be obtained by going to the Summer Scholars web site at www.oucom.ohiou.edu/SummerScholars. The deadline for application is **March 1, 2013**.

- **The Enrichment Summer Program (ESP) through the College of Veterinary Medicine at Michigan State University** is geared toward **undergraduate** students with an interest in **veterinary medicine**. This **seven-week program** focuses on the **professional and educational** aspects of the field with the objective of developing **well-qualified prospective students from disadvantaged backgrounds**. ESP's goal is to introduce prospective students to the profession and, for students who choose this career path, assist them in pursuing and earning a **Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree**. Application is due **March 1, 2013** and can be found [here](#).
- **Pre-Health Summer Enrichment Program**. The University of South Florida Morsani College of Medicine, Office of Student Diversity and Enrichment, and the Area Health Education Center (AHEC) Program invite you to apply to the Pre-Health Summer Enrichment Program (PSEP). PSEP is an **intensive six-week full-time summer program** for **highly motivated** college students interested in **pursuing a career in the health professions**. They are seeking **rising sophomores** (finishing freshman year April, 2013) to take part in an enriching educational and experiential summer program that will run from **May 11, 2013 to June 21, 2013**. The PSEP session includes clinical, academic and **hands-on opportunities** to learn more about medicine and other health careers. There will be sessions from the 5 components of USF Health, which are: **College of Medicine, College of Nursing, College of Public Health, School of Physical Therapy, and the College of Pharmacy**.
