Zika Virus

Zika virus is a mosquito-borne virus that is spreading rapidly in the Americas and beyond.

The most common symptoms are fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes).

The virus is linked to poor pregnancy outcomes and babies born with birth defects.

WHO officially declared Zika a public health emergency, indicating the disease requires an international coordinated response.
