



Seidman Registration Information

It's that time of year again! Registration for the next academic year, spring/summer 2014, fall 2014, and winter 2015, begins in March! Preparing early for registration is the key to securing a schedule that best meets your needs and interests. Here's the best process:

1. Take time NOW to review your degree evaluation (MyPath) to prepare for registration. MyPath reports are accessible through My Banner and instructions are posted on the Seidman Undergraduate Programs Blackboard Announcements.
2. The DRAFT schedule is available NOW. Start picking the days and times for your courses, but **BE SURE TO DOUBLE CHECK** after the schedule becomes official on March 1, 2014. Remember to select a few alternate sections just in case your first options are closed by your registration day.
3. GET YOUR OVERRIDES EARLY!!!
 - a. **Juniors and Seniors who have been admitted to the Seidman College of Business and have between a 2.5 and 2.749 GPA will need overrides to register for 300/400 level Seidman courses.** Once you have chosen your courses, email your name, G number, and schedule (semester and courses only – NOT the sections) to go2gvbiz@gvsu.edu. DO THIS SOON!
 - b. **If you are a junior or senior with a 2.499 or lower GPA**, please seek an appointment with the Seidman Undergraduate Programs office immediately. Call 616-331-7500 to schedule an appointment.
 - c. Any student with a 2.75 or higher overall GPA, and who will have at least 55 credit hours by the semester in which they want to take the course, will be able to register for 300/400 level Seidman courses.

If you would like to review your remaining requirements with a Seidman academic advisor, we encourage you to call the Seidman Undergraduate Programs office at 616-331-7500 to set up an appointment AS SOON AS POSSIBLE! Appointments are available on both the Grand Rapids and Allendale campuses. Advising on the Allendale campus is held Tuesday and Wednesday by appointment only. To schedule an appointment for either campus, please call 616-331-7500 and be sure to identify which campus you prefer.

New Dean Appointed for Seidman College of Business

The current dean of the business school at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota was appointed dean of the Seidman College of Business. Diana R. Lawson will replace H. James Williams, who was named president of Fisk University in Nashville, Tennessee, last year.

Lawson is dean and professor of marketing at St. Cloud State's Herberger Business School. She earned master's of business administration and doctoral degrees from Kent State University. She earned a master's degree in physical education/exercise physiology from Kent State and a bachelor's degree in physical education/sports medicine from State University of New York at Cortland.

Provost Gayle R. Davis said the search committee was impressed with Lawson's familiarity with business college leadership and her superior knowledge of the complexities of universities.

"Her ease with people and her interest in community involvement will serve her well in her new role," Davis said. "She has the creativity and drive Grand Valley needs as we push our academic programming forward to meet the needs of students and businesses in our state."

Both President Thomas J. Haas and Davis noted Lawson's ability to connect the community with a thriving business college as an area that set her apart from other candidates. Haas added: "I am impressed with the wealth of experience Dr. Lawson brings to the table. She has a good balance of undergraduate and graduate perspectives with a vision for relevant strategies that will help attract and retain the talent we need in Michigan. She is the right fit for Grand Valley."

Lawson said she was honored to be selected as the next dean for the Seidman College of Business. "I look forward to working with the faculty and staff to continue advancing the rigor and relevance of programs and enhancing the college's capacity to serve as a leader in business education regionally, nationally, and beyond," she said.

Lawson begins her duties July 1. Associate Dean and Economics Professor, Dr. John Reifel will serve as interim dean until then.



Library Help When You Need It


