#### What is TPSSS?

TRIO Teacher Preparation Student Support Services (TPSSS) is a federally funded program designed for students who have indicated an interest in pursuing a degree in K-12 education. TPSSS provides undergraduate students with enhanced academic and personal support through advising, coaching, test preparation and tutoring.



# **Interesting Facts**

### TRIO TPSSS eligible students are being left behind

High school seniors that go straight to college after graduation

- 38% of TRIO TPSSS eligible seniors
- 81% of their peers in the highest income

#### Students that receive a bachelor degree

- 21% of TRIO TPSSS eligible students
- 45% of their peers in the highest income

#### Student Support Services help eligible students

Students enrolled in programs saw GPAs rise and remained in good academic standing

- o GPA rise from a 2.3 in their freshman year to a 2.6 by their senior year
- 77% of those who started college in were in good academic standing
- By their senior year, 88% were in good academic standing

To receive assistance, students must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Have an interest in becoming a K-12 educator
- Be a first-generation college student (neither parents have completed a bachelor's degree from a four-year institute)
- AND/OR meet specific income guidelines established by the U.S. Department of Education
