TRIO Teacher Preparation Student Support Services (TPSSS) is a federally funded program designed for students who have indicated an interest in pursuing a degree in K-12 education. TPSSS provides undergraduate students with enhanced academic and personal support through advising, coaching, test preparation and tutoring.

Students participate in educational activities, seminars and K-12 student tutoring experiences and mentoring partnerships to maximize their success in college and beyond.


