### Track A

**Track A** is a 49 to 52 credit coordinated graduate program designed for those <u>who need supervised</u> <u>practice</u>. Classes are taught using the hybrid model, with some Saturday laboratory experiences. Upon successful completion, this program provides eligibility to sit for the registration exam leading to the RDN credentials. **Track A application deadline: January 15<sup>th</sup>** (accepting applications until seats are filled)

#### **University Requirements**

- 1. A baccalaureate degree from an accredited institution of higher education
- 2. Submission of all required admission materials, including:
  - Completed GVSU <u>graduate application</u> for admission
  - \$30 nonrefundable application fee (unless you have previously applied to Grand Valley)
  - Official copies of transcripts from all institutions of higher education previously attended.
     Transcripts must be sent from those institutions directly to the GVSU Admissions Office.

### NOTE: We do not require official transcripts from Grand Valley

 Test scores from the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language), or IELTS (International English Language Testing System), or MELAB (Michigan English Language Assessment Battery) for applicants whose native language is not English. Only original score reports will be accepted.

#### **Program Requirements**

In addition to the "University Requirements" above, all students seeking admission must also meet the following program requirements:

- 1. **Minimum 3.0 grade point cumulative average** from all undergraduate coursework
- 2. **Personal statement** of career goals and background experiences, including an explanation of how this program will help achieve educational and professional objectives
- 3. **Two recommendations:** Two academic or professional recommendations. Applicants will provide email addresses of two references when applying (<a href="www.gvsu.edu/gradapply">www.gvsu.edu/gradapply</a>). Recommenders will receive an electronic form to complete and return via email.
- 4. Personal interview
- 5. **Documentation and evaluation** of community service or work experience in food and nutrition
- Successful completion of all prerequisite courses
   OR Verification statement from an ACEND accredited undergraduate program
- 7. \*Grade of a B- (2.7) or better in BMS 305 or 306, BMS 310, BMS 311, and CHEM 232 or 461 or the equivalent courses
- 8. International Students: **Official transcript credential evaluation** (e.g. WES, ECE)
