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Curriculum Notes

RTX Intervention Intensives – 2 Required RTX 321: Therapeutic Use of Sport in Recreational Therapy (1 cr.) ¹ MTH 108 and MTH 109 may be taken in place of MTH 110 RTX 322: Therapeutic Use of Art in Recreational Therapy (1 cr.) $^{\mathbf{2}}$ BIO 120 is not required and is listed only as a prerequisite to BMS 250. RTX 323: Adventure-Based Interventions in Recreational Therapy (1 cr.) $^{\rm 3}$ BIO 180 (fall) & BIO 280 (winter) may be taken instead of BIO 120 RTX 324: Aquatic-Based Interventions in Recreational Therapy (1 cr.) ⁴ WRT 120 and WRT 130 may be taken in place of WRT 150. $^{\rm 5}$ BMS 208, 290 & 391 may be taken in place of BMS 250 & 251 (BMS 309 is not required) RTX Specialty Areas - 2 Required ⁶ Two Recreational Therapy Intensives are required in this semester. RTX 313: Recreational Therapy for Physical Disability – winter only (3 cr.) ⁷ Two Recreational Therapy Specialty Area electives are required. RTX 315: Recreational Therapy for Mental Health – <u>fall only</u> (3 cr.) RTX 316: Recreational Therapy for Older Adults - winter only (3 cr.) RTX 317: Recreational Therapy for Pediatrics - winter only (3 cr.)

Special Notes:

• This is a suggested curriculum guide and might not be applicable to every student.

Courses that include 'GE' are required classes that are in the major **<u>AND</u>** fulfill a General Education requirement.

Two (2) Supplemental Writing Skills (SWS) courses are required.

Student must have a minimum of 120 credits to graduate with 58 of the 120 credits being from a senior level institution and the final 30 of the 120 credits completed at GVSU. Additional electives may be needed to meet these requirements.

Application Process for Recreational Therapy

Application Information

The Recreational Therapy program at Grand Valley State University (GVSU) is a "Secondary Admission Program" which means that any person interested in taking courses within the program must first be admitted to GVSU and upon meeting admission prerequisites (see below), are required to submit a "Secondary" application.

Transfer students will follow the same process and meet the same criteria. Transfer students should provide a copy of the course syllabus for any recreation/therapeutic recreation classes they want to transfer to Grand Valley State University.

The admissions process for Recreational Therapy consists of three phases. These phases are outlined below:

Phase I

The following application prerequisites should be met or in progress at the time of application.

- Overall GPA of 2.7 or above
- PSY 101 Introductory Psychology

Phase II

The application consists of the following components, all of which must be completed and submitted by **February 15th**, for priority consideration. Applications will continue to be accepted until all program seats are filled. Applications and supplemental forms are available online at <u>www.gvsu.edu/rectx</u>

- ✓ GVSU Undergraduate Application (only required for students who are not currently a GVSU student)
- ✓ Recreational Therapy Program Application (submitted online)
- ✓ Essay on why you have selected Recreational Therapy as a major. Be sure to include your leadership experience and work with individuals who have disabilities.
- ✓ Statement of Professional Goals identifying future goals in Recreational Therapy
- ✓ Fifty (50) hours of volunteer or paid work in a therapeutic setting. Twenty (20) hours must be under the supervision of a Certified Therapeutic Recreation Specialist (CTRS)
 - Document using "Verification of Paid/Volunteer Work History" form (on website)
- ✓ Official and updated transcripts from all non-GVSU colleges/universities sent directly to GVSU Admissions
- ✓ Two (2) Recommendations on program specific forms from Recreational Therapist, related health care, or other recreation professionals with whom the applicant has completed volunteer or paid work hours.

Phase III

Upon completion of Phases I and II, applicants will be notified of provisional admission into the program and will be asked to set up an advising appointment with a member of the Recreational Therapy faculty and will be able to register for the first semester of program coursework (RTX 300, RTX 302, RTX 304 & RTX 389). Upon successful completion of these four courses (80% competency/B- in each course), they will be granted full admission into the Recreational Therapy program.

For priority consider application and all supplemental materials should be submitted online by <u>February 15</u>. Applications will be accepted after the deadline until all program seats are filled.
