Cape Coast, Ghana - In exploring the southern coast of Charleston, South Carolina, traveling across the "Great Atlantic" to touch down in Amsterdam, Netherlands, and continuing on to Cape Coast, Ghana, students actually experience an old route of the trans-Atlantic slave trade; they see a clear connection between the Americas and Africa, between home and away.
