#### ✓ Apply for Housing early!

#### HOUSING

#### gvsu.edu/housing

Now that you have been admitted to Grand Valley, we recommend that you apply for housing as soon as possible as housing assignments are first-come, first-served.

GVSU offers many styles of housing to meet individual needs, lifestyles, and fit a variety of budgets. Traditional style is the default preference for all incoming freshmen. Learn more about housing styles at **gvsu.edu/housing/options**.

When living on campus, all living expenses are included in the rate; you manage one consolidated bill. Students enjoy living on campus because of the convenience to dining, classrooms, study areas, and recreation spaces.

#### **Important Information:**

- First-year students are required to live on campus.
- Complete an online application at **gvsu.edu/housing**.
- Many first-year students choose their specific housing assignments through the room self-selection process which opens in early summer for fall start students. The sooner a student completes the housing application, the sooner they'll gain access to the self-selection process. Details about the room selection process will be sent to students' GVSU email.
- First-year students are only eligible for a housing assignment upon completing a housing application and reserving an Orientation session.
- After applying for housing, students will receive instructions to their GVSU email address for My College Roomie, GVSU's roommate matching and connection platform. Completing the preference questionnaire on My College Roomie is essential, as it informs room and roommate assignments.
- Roommate requests must be mutual, be received by May 1 for fall start students, and are not guaranteed.

# FINANCIAL AID gvsu.edu/finaid

#### **FAFSA**

Financial aid is available from various sources, including scholarships, grants, loans, and work study. To be considered for these types of aid, students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). For maximum aid consideration, submit the FAFSA by March 1.

FAFSA is available online at **studentaid.gov/fafsa**. Be sure to include **GVSU school code 002268** to ensure we receive your information.

#### **Scholarships**

Grand Valley offers merit-based scholarships for students based on GPA. Students admitted by March 1 are automatically considered for GVSU merit scholarships. Initial eligibility is assessed upon admission, with further scholarship and grant decisions communicated through the Office of Financial Aid. Final scholarship determinations are made by July 31.

GVSU provides access to the **myScholarships** database to match students with both GVSU department-specific and donor-funded scholarships, as well as access to more than 10,000 external scholarship opportunities.

The majority of GVSU scholarship deadlines fall between January and March 1, while external scholarship deadlines vary year-round. Students may search and apply for these scholarships each year through gvsu.edu/myscholarships.

#### **ORIENTATION**

#### gvsu.edu/orientation

Grand Valley does not require an enrollment deposit. To indicate your commitment to attend GVSU, sign up for Orientation and pay the Orientation fee by May 1. After May 1, we cannot guarantee space in the incoming class.

If you cancel your application to Grand Valley prior to May 1, the Orientation fee is refundable.

#### Final High School Transcript

Incoming freshman must submit a final high school transcript, including graduation date, to GVSU before enrollment to comply with federal and state regulations. Contact your high school if you have any questions about submitting a final high school transcript.

#### **Completed College-Level Coursework**

Students may be eligible to receive advanced placement or college credit by taking examinations available nationally, including Advanced Placement (AP), among others. To learn more visit gvsu.edu/cbe.

If you have completed college-level coursework through dual enrollment or early/middle college, you must have your previous institution send your official transcript to GVSU prior to your Orientation session.

#### **Network ID**

As a GVSU student, you'll use a Network ID and password for access to computer labs, email, Banner, multifactor authentication, and more. Instructions to activate your username and password will be emailed to you.

#### **GVSU Email**

Grand Valley provides a free Gmail account through Google Apps for Education. This Gmail account will be the official communication method used by the University once you're enrolled in classes. You will be able to access your GVSU email by visiting **mail.gvsu.edu** once you set up your GVSU network account.

#### Internet Access

As a GVSU student, you have free access to the internet on campus, either through the wired ports or wireless access. You can find instructions to set up your computer to the wireless network on our website at <code>gvsu.edu/it</code>.

#### **Blackboard**

Blackboard is an online course management system that faculty members can use for distributing course materials, communicating with students, posting assignments and grades, and much more. ### **ELECTRONIC BILLING**

#### gvsu.edu/studentaccounts

Student electronic billing information can be accessed at **gvsu.edu/banner**. Students will receive email notifications for new charges or upcoming payments. Parents, if their email was provided, will also receive notifications. Accessing financial information requires the student's Network ID and password, issued upon admission to GVSU. Students can authorize third-party access through proxy setup to view and manage online bills and payments. Instructions for providing proxy access can be found at **gvsu.edu/studentaccounts**.

#### The Rapid Bus System

GVSU provides daily bus service between the Valley Campus, City Campus, Health Campus, and the surrounding area. GVSU as well as The Rapid transit routes are free to current students with a valid Grand Valley ID card.

#### **PARKING ON CAMPUS**

#### gvsu.edu/parking

Parking your vehicle on a GVSU campus requires a parking permit.

#### **Parking Permits**

#### **Permit costs:**

- \$240 per semester for those commuting to campus and enrolled in seven or more credit hours.
- \$150 per semester for those commuting to campus and enrolled in six or fewer credit hours.
- \$210 per semester for students living on campus in GVSU housing.

Permits can be purchased online with the Citizen Connect portal, found at **gvsu.edu/parking**. The cost of the permit will be billed to your student account.

Parking permit costs are subject to change. Visit **gvsu.edu/parking** for the most up-to-date information.

#### **Other Parking Options**

- **Temporary day permits** are available for purchase online through the Citizen Connect Portal at a cost of \$10 per day and will be billed to your student account.
- Pay-to-park short-term options are available on each campus and can be found on the Parking Services website.
- Parents and guests can get a free visitor parking permit at two locations: the Service Building on the north end of the Valley Campus or the City Campus at 102 Eberhard Center.
