Request to have your official transcript from your high school sent to Grand Valley.

Test Results. Grand Valley offers a test-optional admission policy, allowing applicants to decide whether to submit SAT and/or ACT scores. Submission of these scores is not mandatory. However, applicants aiming for our top scholarships should provide their test scores for consideration. Additionally, students seeking to showcase strong math proficiency are encouraged to include their test scores in their application. Grand Valley's code for the SAT is 1258 and for the ACT is 2005. Full details can be found at **gysu.edu/financialaid/merit.**

Admission Notification. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis, as they're received throughout the year, once your application is complete and submitted. If you have questions or concerns, contact the Admissions and Recruitment Office at (616) 331-2025, toll free at (800) 748-0246, or admissions@gvsu.edu.

Application Submission Deadlines. The Admissions and Recruitment Office must receive your complete application at least 30 calendar days before the final day of registration for the semester in which you wish to enroll. However, admission to any semester is subject to earlier closing without notice. Admitted freshmen must submit enrollment/orientation fee by May 1 to guarantee a place in the freshman class.

All documents and supporting data required for admission become the property of Grand Valley State University and will not be returned to you.

Grand Valley grants admission to students who are prepared to meet the challenges of a rigorous university curriculum.

Freshman applicants will be reviewed using a combination of high school courses completed, cumulative grade point average, standardized test scores, grade point trend, and other factors provided by the applicant.

Send final high school transcripts with proof of high school graduation included to the GVSU Admissions and Recruitment Office by June 30.

Students earning college credit or a postsecondary award prior to graduating high school, or at the same time as high school graduation, are considered a first-time student in the fall (freshman admission). This would include dual-enrollment students and early/middle college students.



TRANSFER ADMISSION

If you have attended an accredited institution of higher learning after high school, you are considered a transfer student.

Official Transcripts. You must request that official transcripts be sent to the Admissions and Recruitment Office at Grand Valley from each college attended (whether you earned credits or not). If you have completed fewer than 30 semester hours of credit (if applying for Summer 2026 or earlier) and 12 semester hours of credit (if applying for Fall 2026 or later), you must request that your official high school transcript be sent to Grand Valley as well.

Admission Notification. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis once your file is complete. If you questions or concerns, contact the Admissions and Recruitment Office at (616) 331-2025, toll free at (800) 748-0246, or admissions@gvsu.edu.

Application Filing Deadlines. The Admissions and Recruitment Office must receive your complete application at least 30 calendar days prior to the first day of classes for the semester in which you wish to enroll.

All documents and supporting data required for admission become the property of Grand Valley State University and will not be returned to you.

Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). Students who attend a Michigan community college and complete the MTA agreement will have satisfied the Foundations categories of the General Education Program.

ADMISSION DECISIONS

Grand Valley State University has a rolling admission policy and reviews applications and makes admission decisions as students' files are completed.

ORIENTATION

The Admissions and Recruitment Office will notify admitted students of upcoming orientation sessions when they become available. Admitted undergraduate students must submit their orientation fee by May 1 (for a fall semester start) to guarantee a place in the incoming class. Orientation sessions include advising and class registration, as well as an introduction to Grand Valley support services.

HOUSING INFORMATION

You must be admitted to Grand Valley before you can apply for on-campus housing. Grand Valley will send you information about housing once you've been admitted. Incoming first-year freshmen students are required to reside on campus. Transfer and graduate students are encouraged but not required to live on campus. Applying early may improve the chances of receiving your preferred style, but does not guarantee a placement in the requested style.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

- The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be completed by you and/or your parents or spouse. You should fill out the FAFSA completely and accurately. Do not leave blank spaces. Indicate zeros in situations that do not apply. The FAFSA is the only form you need to use to apply for need-based financial aid and loans. For maximum consideration for need-based aid, applicants should file the FAFSA by March 1. The Grand Valley FAFSA code is 002268.
- 2. To be considered for non-need, merit-based academic scholarships, incoming freshmen must be admitted to the university by March 1. Students who are admitted by March 1 may submit additional materials by July 31 to be reconsidered for merit scholarships, such as an updated official transcript or test scores. Transfer students admitted by March 1 for spring/summer admission, July 1 for fall admission, and November 1 for winter admission will be considered for merit scholarships.
- 3. Grand Valley's Financial Aid Office may request additional information if, upon reviewing data you have presented, we believe that further clarification of your financial situation is needed. Such information may include submission of the applicant's or parents' IRS 1040 forms.
- 4. General eligibility requirements for federal aid require a valid Social Security number. To assist with your financial aid, please complete this field on the application.
- All students applying for federal student financial aid should provide a final high school transcript to the Admissions and Recruitment Office.
