

APPLICATION FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION



FRESHMAN ADMISSION

1. Complete items 1 through 35 on the attached tear-off application. Do not forget to sign your completed application. Send application to: Admissions Office, Grand Valley State University, 1 Campus Drive, Allendale, MI 49401. You may apply online at gvsu.edu/apply.
2. Request an official transcript from your high school.
3. Admission Test Results. Michigan Applicants: Submit results of the ACT or SAT. When you take the test, list Grand Valley as one of the recipients of your scores. Our school code for the ACT is 2005. Grand Valley's code for the SAT is 1258. Exception: Applicants who have been out of high school for three or more years are not required to submit either of the test scores. GVSU is test-optional for general admission. However, some scholarships do require official, qualifying test scores to be awarded the scholarship. Full details can be found on our financial aid website.
4. Admission Notification. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis once your file is complete. Grand Valley prides itself on quick response times on applications. You can expect to hear from Grand Valley within three weeks. If you have not received a confirmation within that time, contact the Admissions Office at (616) 331-2025 or toll free at (800) 748-0246.
5. Application Filing Deadlines. The Admissions Office must receive your complete application at least 30 calendar days before the final day of registration for the semester in which you wish to enroll. However, admission to any semester is subject to earlier closing without notice. Admitted freshmen must submit enrollment/orientation fee by May 1 to guarantee a place in the freshman class.
6. All documents and supporting data required for admission become the property of Grand Valley State University and will not be returned to you.
7. Grand Valley grants admission to students who are prepared to meet the challenges of a rigorous university curriculum. Freshman applicants will be reviewed using a combination of high school courses completed, cumulative grade point average, standardized test scores, grade point trend, and other factors provided by the applicant.
8. Send final high school transcripts with verification of high school graduation included to the GVSU Admissions Office by June 30.
9. Students earning college credit or a postsecondary award prior to graduating high school, or at the same time as high school graduation, are considered a first-time student in the fall (freshman admission). This would include dual-enrollment students and early/middle college students.

TRANSFER ADMISSION

Note: If you have attended an accredited institution of higher learning after high school, you are considered a transfer student.

2. Official Transcripts. You must request that official transcripts be sent from each college attended (whether you earned credits or not) to the Admissions Office at Grand Valley. If you have completed fewer than 30 semester (or 45 quarter) hours of credit, you must request that an official high school transcript be sent to Grand Valley as well.
3. Admission Notification. Admission decisions are made on a rolling basis once your file is complete. Grand Valley prides itself on quick response times on applications. You can expect to hear from Grand Valley within three weeks. If you have not received a confirmation within that time, contact the Admissions Office at (616) 331-2025 or toll free at (800) 748-0246.
4. Application Filing Deadlines. The Admissions Office must receive your complete application at least 30 calendar days prior to the first day of classes before the final day of registration for the semester in which you wish to enroll.
5. All documents and supporting data required for admission become the property of Grand Valley State University and will not be returned to you.
6. Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA). Students who attend a Michigan community college and complete the MTA agreement will have satisfied the Foundations categories of the General Education Program.

ADMISSION DECISIONS

Grand Valley State University has a rolling admission policy and reviews applications and makes admission decisions as students' files are completed.

ORIENTATION, ACADEMIC ADVISING, AND REGISTRATION

1. Orientation: The Admissions Office will notify admitted students of upcoming advising and registration sessions. Admitted freshman students must submit their enrollment/orientation fee by May 1 to guarantee a place in the freshman class. In addition, a comprehensive introduction to Grand Valley will occur prior to the beginning of the semester for which a student will attend classes. These sessions include information on support services and university resources available to new students.
2. Academic Advising: Students will meet with faculty members or advisors before they make their class selections. Advisement takes place in conjunction with registration.
3. Registration: The Admissions Office will notify you of available registration dates. Consult the Grand Valley State University Annual Class Schedule for complete information about registration dates. An annual schedule is available online for students to register for an entire year of coursework.

HOUSING INFORMATION

You must be admitted to Grand Valley before you can apply for on-campus housing. The Admissions Office will send you information about housing once you've been admitted. Incoming first-year freshmen students are required to reside on campus. Transfer and graduate students are encouraged but not required to live on campus. Applying early may improve the chances of receiving your preferred style, but does not guarantee a placement in the requested style.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

1. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be completed by you and/or your parents or spouse. You should fill out the FAFSA completely and accurately. Do not leave blank spaces. Indicate zeros in situations that do not apply. The FAFSA is the only form you need to use to apply for need-based financial aid and loans. For maximum consideration for need-based aid, applicants should file the FAFSA by March 1. The Grand Valley FAFSA code is 002268.
2. To be considered for non-need, merit-based academic scholarships, incoming freshmen must be admitted to the university by March 1. Transfer students submitted by March 1st for spring/summer admission, July 1st for fall admission and November 1st for winter admission. Final 2023 scholarship decisions are made by July 31.
3. Grand Valley's Financial Aid Office may request additional information if, upon reviewing data you have presented, we believe that further clarification of your financial situation is needed. Such information may include submission of the applicant's or parents' IRS 1040 forms.
4. General eligibility requirements for federal aid require a valid Social Security number. To assist with your financial aid, please complete this field on the application.
5. All students applying for federal student financial aid should provide a final high school transcript to the Admissions Office.

Admission to Grand Valley does not guarantee admission to certain undergraduate or entry-level graduate degree programs. Students must fulfill additional requirements before they may declare a major in any of the programs listed below.
