Civil Engineers

A civil engineer designs and oversees the construction of public works, such as roads, bridges, dams, tunnels, buildings, airports, water and sewage systems, and other large infrastructure projects.

Buildings and bridges are often the first structures to come to mind, because they are the most obvious engineering creations. But civil engineers are also responsible for less visible creations and contributions like harbors, channels, dams, irrigation projects, pipelines, and power plants.

Landscape Architects

Landscape Architecture Managers oversees, manages, and schedules the development of exterior spaces and physical environments, the development of schematic designs and construction details, and is ultimately responsible for final project. Supervises all related activities of a staff of landscape architects and technicians. Being a Manager of Landscape Architecture typically reports to top management. Requires a bachelor's degree in a related field. The Manager of Landscape Architecture manages subordinate staff in the day-to-day performance of their jobs. True first level manager. Ensures that project/department milestones/goals are met and adhering to approved budgets. Has full authority for personnel actions. Extensive knowledge of department processes. Working as a Manager of Landscape Architecture typically requires 5 years experience in the related area as an individual contributor. 1 to 3 years supervisory experience may be required.
