What is the FLATS Exam?

The FLATS exam is an on-line language exam developed by Brigham Young University to test beginning-level (i.e., 101, 102, and 201 *NOT 202*) listening comprehension, reading comprehension, and grammatical accuracy. Modern Languages and Literatures uses this exam to give students an opportunity to test out of the BA requirement in languages not offered at GVSU. FLATS is currently available in 52 languages.

What you need to know about the exam:

 Please enter the Proctor information as shown on the other attached document.
- It is your responsibility to arrange the time <u>(at least one week in advance)</u> of your exam with the proctor; do not expect the proctor to contact you and do not show up to take your exam without contacting the proctor first. Email: <u>salindol@gvsu.edu</u> or Phone: 616.331.3203.
- Exam cost is \$50 paid via credit card on-line.
- No study guides are available as this exam is designed for students who already have working knowledge of the language.
- You have 2.5 hours to complete the exam without access to phone, notes, etc. •

A headset will be available for you to complete the listening portion.

- <u>College credit cannot be earned</u> by taking this exam; it can only be used to waive the BA language requirement. The exam is pass/fail; partial credit cannot be earned either. You will be required to take a language offered at GVSU if you do not pass all three levels (101, 102, and 201). This exam can be taken **one time** only.
