THIS IS A **GENERAL** CURRICULUM GUIDE AND IS NOT APPLICABLE TO EVERY STUDENT. IT IS IMPORTANT TO MEET WITH YOUR ADVISOR.

German major (33 credits)

Core (15-18 credits)

— **GER 301 Composition*** (3)

Prerequisites: GER 202 with a grade of C (not C-) or better or placement

*GER 302 can be taken BEFORE GER 301

— **GER 302 Conversation*** (3)

Prerequisites: GER 202 with a grade of C (not C-) or better or placement

Unless otherwise noted, the pre-requisite for all 300 level courses is GER 301 and GER 302.

One may be taken concurrently as long as the other has already been completed.

— **Choose one advanced language course from the following:**

GER 341 Advanced German Grammar (3)

GER 342 Advanced Speaking (3)

GER 385 Study Abroad (3)

Choose one linguistics course from the following:

GER 321 Improving German Pronunciation (3)

GER 322 Introduction to German Linguistics (3)

***GER 421 History of the German Language** (3)

Prerequisites: Two 300-level courses beyond GER 301 and GER 302 or permission of instructor

* GER 421 can double dip linguistics and 400 level course requirement

GER 402 German Authors Prerequisites for 401 and 402: Two 300-level courses beyond GER 301 and GER 302 or permission of instructor

***GER 421 History of the German Language** (3)

Prerequisites: Two 300-level courses beyond GER 301 and GER 302 or permission of instructor

— **GER 495 Advanced Topics in German-Capstone** (3)

Prerequisites: Senior standing with a major in German

Electives (18 credits)

— **Elective Course GER** ___ (3)

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Elective options: Any course not taken from the above or any of the courses listed below.

- GER 304, Introduction to German Literature II
- GER 311, The Long Nineteenth Century

¹ Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should normally take this course in the winter semester of their first year.

Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

Guide for Declaring German Major

1. Log into myBanner from the GVSU homepage
2. Once logged in select "Student", "Student Records", and then, "Change Major"
3. Click on the "Change Major 1/Program" box
4. Click on the down arrow in the box next to "New Major 1/Program," from here scroll down and choose "German -BA"
5. Click "Submit" and then "Change to New Program"
