A4. Project Feasibility

Example 1

A. Goals

The primary purpose of this project is to support the resiliency of young children with communication disorders through (a) exploring differences in attitudes and interactions of caregivers and their children with and without communication disorders and (b) a caregiver-led bibliotherapy intervention study. We propose to complete an ongoing longitudinal study that has been following young children with and without communication disorders and their primary caregivers and to pilot a study in which the primary caregiver is trained to provide a bibliotherapy intervention to target improved resiliency in their child.

Goal 1: Evaluate child and caregiver attitudes and interactions for children with and without communication disorders.

We will continue conducting a study entitled " " in which we have been following young children, between the ages of 2.5 and 6 years old, and their primary caregiver for six months and evaluating the child's speech and language skills, attitudes toward the child's communication, and parent-perceived responses and stress related to their child's communication. Study procedures include speech-language evaluations conducted at study entry, three months later, six months later, and monthly caregiver surveys. Currently, 14 child-caregiver dyads have completed the study, and an additional 6 are enrolled in the study. We expect to reach our participant goal of 30 dyads by the Spring semester and have approximately 15 visits to complete during S3. Whereas primarily observes study visits and enters data at present. will take on additional responsibilities as part of S3 project, such as scheduling visits, consenting and collecting data from the caregivers, and helping to write the evaluation reports. This experience will contribute to her knowledge and confidence in working with caregivers and young children and writing evaluation reports that are similar to the ones she will write as a speechlanguage pathologist. Dr. will help at each visit and review all reports.

Goal 2: Pilot an intervention study to improve the resilience and coping of children with communication disorders and their primary caregivers.

and I have been developing a bibliotherapy study that we expect to conduct, following IRB approval, during the Spring/Summer semester. This bibliotherapy study will include individual, weekly caregiver coaching sessions in which the caregiver is introduced to a children's book targeting improved resilience and activities to complete with their child. Study participation includes a comprehensive speech and language evaluation for the child and a four-week intervention period; the weekly parent coaching will be completed via zoom or phone. Our target is to enroll 6-8 children-caregiver dyads. The children must be 5-8

speech-language services. To reach our recruitment target, we will invite previous participants of studies within Dr. 's lab and reach out to local pediatric speech and language clinics. We believe our target is reasonable given (a) that several families that have participated in previous studies are eligible for participation and (b) the virtual nature of the study, which lessens the burden on participants to drive to campus on a regular basis. has helped develop this study, including book selection and activity development. has also worked closely with Dr. to identify measures to measure both child and parent change. We plan to submit our completed IRB application in late March/Early February to allow time for revisions prior to the start of S3. Conducting this study will help gain valuable experience coaching caregivers to use the activities developed with their children. will help them troubleshoot any issues and gather pre- and postintervention data. Goal 3: Explore differences in attitudes of caregivers of children with stuttering and speech sound disorder related to their child's communication skills As we conduct study visits for the previously-mentioned two goals, we will also spend time analyzing extant data from the longitudinal study. Will be given the opportunity to develop and answer 2-3 research questions related to attitudes toward stuttering and/or their child's communication using extant data from participants' first visit. expressed an interest in analyzing data and reported greatly enjoyed the previous STATS course completed at GVSU. This goal will allow to use statistical analysis to answer research questions without being dependent on the other objectives. I will support through this goal and we will meet with the GVSU Stats Center as needed. The expected outcome is a research poster appropriate for an academic conference. B. Area of Expertise The proposed studies build upon work from us both. Dr. has extensive experience conducting longitudinal studies with young children and their caregivers (e.g., , 2020; 2021). has also published a measure that will be used in both studies to explore caregiver responses to their child's communication (et al., 2022). Together, we have been working on a bibliotherapy study that targets emotional coping in young children, which informed the proposed bibliotherapy study. We are also both comfortable with REDCap, which will be used to collect and store data for both proposed

D. Budget

We will also purchase a large desktop monitor with webcam and an external multi-directional microphone so that both researchers can be seen and heard during the virtual parent coaching sessions.

E. Responsible Conduct of Research

We are both up-to-date on our CITI Training. The study targeted in Goals 1 and 3 has been approved by the Institutional Review Board (20-337-H-GVSU). As of February 2023, we are currently writing the IRB application for the study targeted in Goal 2. We expect to submit our application by late February/early March and have approval prior to the start of the summer semester.
