Example 3

In addition to the required events of the Student Summer Scholars program the student expects to present [REDACTED] research at one conference, a public event and pursue publication. First [REDACTED] will submit a proposal to present at the annual [REDACTED] Conference hosted in October by the History Department at Grand Valley State University. Undergraduate students have successfully applied to this conference in the past and received discipline specific commentary from professional historians throughout the region. [REDACTED] will also seek to disseminate [REDACTED] findings through the Grand Valley Journal of History, a peer-reviewed, student-run publication at GVSU. [REDACTED] will make final revisions to [REDACTED] paper after considering comments made at the [REDACTED] Conference in October. Then [REDACTED] will submit an edited version of [REDACTED] paper to the Grand Valley Journal of History before the end of the Fall, 2023 semester.

Lastly, in [REDACTED] role as Director of the [REDACTED] Professor [REDACTED] will coordinate with the [REDACTED] Council to schedule, organize and promote a public event for [REDACTED] to present at. There are two annual event possibilities that the research would fit into well, one is the [REDACTED] event held at the [REDACTED] Public Library in January and another is the [REDACTED] Office's Annual Roundtable in March.
