



Why Study Management Information Systems?

To lead others in a world of constant change and intense competition, you need a management major. The MIS emphasis provides students with the appropriate knowledge and skills to define, design, and develop management information systems. Specialized skills in the area of Enterprise Resource Planning equip students with a strong technical background, but emphasizes the business knowledge and analytical skills necessary in today's business environment.

The goal of the Information Systems emphasis is to provide students with the following:

- An understanding of integrated business processes
- Experience using enterprise software (SAP ® ERP) to execute business processes
- An understanding of necessary capabilities of reporting and analysis software to support business decision-making
- Experience applying reporting and analytic techniques to translate business requirements into operational business intelligence decisions
