Board of Trustees member will address graduates

More than 1,150 students will participate in Grand Valley's fall semester commencement ceremony, set for Saturday,

December 8, at 10 a.m. at Van Andel Arena in Grand Rapids.

John C. Kennedy, member of Grand Valley's Board of Trustees, will give the commencement address. Kennedy, president and CEO of Autocam Medical, will end his second board term at the end of December. The ceremony will be webcast

and available at gvsu.edu/commencement.

An active community member, Kennedy also serves as a board member for Grand Rapids University Preparatory Academy, Lacks Enterprises, Shape Corporation, Van Andel Institute, Acton Institute, West Michigan Policy Forum, the Right Place, and as an advisory board member of the University

of Michigan's Ross School of Business, and Samuel Zell and Robert H. Lurie Institute for Entrepreneurial Studies.

State Sen. Arlan B. Meekhof and Raleigh J. Finkelstein will receive honorary degrees.

Meekhof (R-West Olive) was first elected to serve

the 30th Senate District in 2010. He was chosen by his Republican colleagues to serve as majority floor leader for the 2011-2014 term, and was elected as Senate Majority Leader for his second term. He also serves as chair of the Government Operations committee and the Michigan Capitol committee.

Finkelstein was the lead donor for the initial building in Grand Valley's expanding Health Campus and the building was named in his honor. He worked with his brothers to grow their parents' business into what was MC

Sporting Goods. After selling the retail chain, the brothers maintain an active real estate business.

The Alumni Association will present its Young Alumni Award to Mark Switzer, who earned a bachelor's degree in film and video in 2011 and a

master's degree in school counseling in 2014.

Switzer is a career counselor at Gogebic Community College. Switzer works with students who are the first in their families to attend college, who have disabilities or live below the poverty line, or are pursuing nontraditional careers. He has written grants to expand the college's food pantry and donated clothing area, and he partnered with Range Suicide Prevention to raise awareness of mental health issues on campus.

New minors on campus policy implemented

Thousands of students under age 18 attend sports and academic camps, workshops and other events on campus. To help ensure the safety of these minors, a new policy has been implemented.

Maureen Walsh, associate vice president and chief human resources officer, said along with the policy an online toolkit was created to assist program directors as new requirements may change some processes. Highlights of the policy and new requirements are listed below; the policy is posted online at http://gvsu.edu/s/0Tc.

- Online registration system: Programs and events that involve minors need to be registered via an online system. Walsh said this also allows the university to capture all programs throughout the year.
- \bullet New release form: A new form is available for parents/guardians. All minors on campus must have a signed release form on file
- Authorized adults: Volunteers, students, faculty and staff who are considered authorized adults need to complete a background check

and be educated about the minors on campus

Informational sessions for program directors have been scheduled: December 3, 1-1:30 p.m. in L. William Seidman Center, room 3001; December 5, 10-10:30 a.m. in Zumberge Hall, room 1000; and December 6, 11-11:30 a.m. in Finkelstein Hall, room 351. These 30-minute sessions are optional and no RSVP is required.

Blackboard Ally supports inclusive education

More than 218,000 digital content items from more than 3,700 courses have been scanned by Blackboard Ally since the software was made available in June to students, faculty and staff

Blackboard Ally scans files uploaded into courses and evaluates the level of accessibility of content by displaying colored "dials" (red, yellow and green). These indicators provide awareness and insight and are only visible to

instructors. The goal is to work to improve the accessibility of the files to turn the dials to green, which provides benefits for the learning needs of all students.

Eric Kunnen, associate director of eLearning and Emerging Technologies, said more accessible content means students have more usable, readable learning materials as well as high-quality alternative formats of content that work better on mobile devices.

"After Ally automatically scans course content, an indicator is displayed that estimates the level of accessibility of the file and a score is provided," Kunnen said. "The system then provides on screen guidance to help make the file more accessible."

So far, more than 464 files have been fixed by 138 faculty members in 146 courses.

Kunnen said Ally supports student success through universal design for learning principles and by building capacity to respond to increased federal and legal requirements for accessibility.

"Ally not only provides benefits to students with

disabilities, but it also supports the university's work in recognizing the importance of accessibility as part of our pathway to inclusive education whereby we support the diverse physical and cognitive needs of all of our students," he said.

The eLearning and Emerging Technologies team offers support to faculty members using Blackboard Ally and has created a webpage with more information, gvsu.edu/elearn/help/ally.

GVSU, Mercy Health partner with MCC to open clinic

Ten years after an idea was first shared, leaders from Muskegon Community College, Grand Valley State University and Mercy Health held a ribbon cutting ceremony November 27 at the new MCC Health and Wellness Center.

The 52,000-square-foot facility on MCC's campus on Quarterline Road will house a health simulation lab, classrooms, a fitness center and gymnasium and a nurse-managed primary care center

The Mercy Health Partners Primary Care Center is a collaboration among MCC, GVSU's

Kirkhof College of Nursing and Mercy Health. The suite contains eight exam rooms, a treatment room and a lab, and will provide Grand Valley nursing students and MCC's nursing, medical assistant and respiratory therapy students with opportunities for clinical experiences.

Cynthia McCurren, dean of KCON, said the three institutions began imagining a nursemanaged primary care center 10 years ago.

"When academia and health care practice collaborate on an endeavor, students will flourish and partnerships will grow into deep commitments," McCurren said.

The center will open to the public in January and offer primary care services to MCC students, faculty and staff members, and the public.

Dr. Kristen Brown, vice president for Mercy Health Physician Partners, said the center will serve a need on Muskegon's east side.
