- A signed copy of your spouse's 2020 Federal Tax Return, Form 1040 and Schedule(s) 1, 2, &/or 3, if filed or 2020 IRS Return Transcript (<https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript>).
- A copy of your marriage license.

Step 2: Household Information

List the people in your household. Include yourself, your spouse and your children if you provide more than half of their support, and other people if they now live with you and you provide more than half of their support and will continue to provide more than half of their support from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. Also, **write in the name of the college** for anyone who will be attending as a degree-seeking student, at least half-time, between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023.
