H – Historical Context

- 1. When and where was this created?
- 2. Place the item in context of concurrent events. Think about what major events or trends occurred during the year it was produced.

A – Audience

- 1. Who is the intended audience of the document?
- 2. How might the intended audience affect the reliability and/or validity of the source?

P – Purpose

1. Why was this source created? Was it meant to persuade, inform, etc.?

P – Point of View

- 1. What do you know about the author and their background?
- 2. From what point of view is the author writing this document?
- 3. Think about potential for bias or an agenda.

Y - "Why?" What's the Significance?

- 1. What is this document trying to convey?
- 2. Why is this document important? What does it tell us about this time, this perspective, this issue, etc.?
