## March 10th Primary: FAQ

Q: Is there a polling location on campus?

A: There is currently no polling location on Grand Valley.

Q: Where can I vote in Allendale?

A: If you are registered to vote in Allendale, you can go to <a href="www.mi.gov/vote">www.mi.gov/vote</a> to check your polling location.

Q: How can I get to my polling location? I don't have a car!

A: Unfortunately, Grand Valley is not providing a shuttle service to local polling locations. However, we encourage you to look into ridesharing apps for rides to polls or grab a ride with a friend!

Q: I'm not registered to vote but I still want to cast my ballot. Is it too late?

A: Not at all! Per new Michigan law, you are eligible to register to vote until 8 PM on Election Day. However, **you have to vote in person** (not online or by filling out the mail-in application). If you want to register in Allendale, you can visit Allendale Township Hall (6678 Lake Michigan Dr).

Q: I'm registered to vote, but not in Allendale. I didn't fill out an absentee ballot and I'm not able to go back home to vote. What can I do?

A: Technically, you are allowed to "re-register" to vote in Allendale if you'd still like to cast your ballot. You can go to the Allendale Township Hall until 8 PM on Election Day to get registered and cast your ballot locally.

Q: Does my permanent address change if I register to vote in Allendale?

A: Yes. If you choose to register in Allendale, you will be considered a resident of this area, so your permanent address—and thus the address on your license—will change as result.

Q: Who do I vote for?

A: That is YOUR choice! Just keep in mind, Michigan is a "closed primary," meaning you have to choose to fill out a ballot for either the Democratic or Republican candidates.
