The advocacy group spent time at the last meeting looking through all the data we have about needs an trying to choose areas to focus on.

We're working on a statement of focus to articulate what we'll be working on and why-we hope that will go out for general comment in a week or two. We are working on the first draft right now. So be on the lookout for that soon.

QUEER CONNECTIONS UPDATE

What is Queer Connections?

Queer Connections (QC) pairs LGBTQ+ students with LGBTQ+ faculty/staff mentors. Mentorship pairs meet throughout the academic year and participate in various program events. QC is a joint program with the Milton E Ford LGBT Center and the LGBT FSA.

Number of mentor/mentee pairs for 24-25: 13

What's new this year?

QC participants were invited to a virtual escape room in January that was a great addition to the program! It was a great way for program participants to meet people who they were not paired with directly and stay connected with their mentees/mentors.

Here's what program participants had to say about the experience:

"Overall, I had a great time. It was fun to see how different people stepped in to get something solved and how we had to work together, especially to look at the different clues while simultaneously applying the info from the clues to something else..."

"I loved the escape room event. I also liked how we can collaborate virtually and still make connections. I think a few options for virtual events is a good idea for the future, especially in the cooler months."

What's next for QC?

Program coordinators are looking forward to adding more programming in the future and even more excited about the end of year celebration this April!

Interested in becoming a mentor? We recruit new mentors in the fall semester and will announce in the newsletter when the interest forms open for the next round of the program.
