

IMMUNIZATIONS AT GVSU

GVSU recommends students be fully immunized prior to attending classes to protect their health. Immunizations are not a university requirement, however certain academic programs, work, or volunteer activities may have other requirements.

Be informed on your current immunization status prior to coming to campus. Help protect yourself from illness and diseases by finding out what immunizations are recommended for you. Talk to your healthcare provider or visit the Center for Disease Control and Prevention website at www.cdc.gov for a full list of recommendations.

Recommended Immunizations	CDC Guidelines
Flu	Annually
Hepatitis B	Three doses
Human papilloma virus	Three doses (men & women age 11-26)
Measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR)	Two doses
Meningitis	Recommended for all first-year students living in residence halls ; other students under age 25 may choose to be vaccinated to reduce their risk of disease. Ask your health care provider if a booster is recommended
Polio	Primary series completed
Tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis	Primary series completed and booster of Td or Tdap within the last 10 years
Varicella (Chicken Pox)	Two doses if you haven't had disease
Pneumoccal vaccine for certain populations to consider	All adults 65 years of age or older, anyone 2 through 64 years of age with certain long-term health problems or weakened immune system, adults 19 through 64 years of age who smoke cigarettes or have asthma
