potential to treat drug-resistant bacterial infections, and they won a state-wide grant to continue their work.

- History Professor James Goode won the Robert H. Ferrell Book Prize for distinguished scholarship.
- Associate Professor Karen Libman received national recognition for her work in theatre for the development of "Bard to Go," the highly successful touring arm of Grand Valley's Shakespeare Festival.
