The Grand Valley State University (GVSU) Charter Schools Office (CSO) is pleased to offer financial support to teachers and administrators employed within our portfolio of schools who wish to participate in graduate courses offered by the GVSU College of Education and Integrative, Religious, and Intercultural Studies Department leading to:

- Professional Master of Arts in Social Innovation
- Master of Education Degrees (M.Ed.)
- Educational Specialist Degrees (Ed.S.)
- Michigan Provisional Certifications
- Michigan Professional Certifications
- Michigan Administrator Certifications
- Michigan School Counseling licenses and endorsements
- Michigan certification renewals and approvals
- Content area endorsements
- Professional development

All graduate level courses offered by the GVSU College of Education are eligible for scholarship funds, including EDR 612 and EDR 613.

Scholarship eligibility criteria is as follows:

- Only individuals in full-time positions requiring a teaching or administrator certificate are eligible to receive scholarship funds.

Starting Fall 2019 Semester:

- 50% tuition coverage for those with less than five years of employment
- 80% tuition coverage for those with five or more years of employment at **current** GVSU authorized school
- Scholarship funds are limited to twelve (12) credits per person, per academic year (Fall semester through Spring/Summer semester).
- In order to receive scholarship funds, applicants must complete the scholarship application before **each** semester.
