

Continuing Education Scholarship Program Process

1) Verify Eligibility

Only individuals employed at GVSU authorized charter schools, in full-time positions requiring a teaching or administrator certificate, are eligible for the scholarship.

Scholarship amount:

- 50% tuition coverage for those with less than five years of employment
- 80% tuition coverage for those with five or more years of employment

Scholarship funds are limited to twelve (12) credits per person, per academic year (Fall Semester through Spring/Summer Semester).

In order to receive scholarship funds, applicants must complete the Scholarship Program Application **before** each semester.

2) Choose Program or Course(s)

All graduate level <u>Education Program</u> courses offered by the College of Education and Community Innovation (CECI) are **automatically eligible** for scholarship funds, including EDR 612 and EDR 613. Undergraduate courses within the <u>Teachable Majors</u> <u>and Minors Endorsements</u> are also **automatically eligible**.

Additionally, courses within the <u>Professional Master of Arts in Social Innovation</u> (PMASI) program, offered by the Integrative, Religious, and Intercultural Studies Department, are **automatically eligible**.

3) Apply to GVSU

- Review the university's <u>Admission</u> requirements and processes.
- Review the university's <u>Tuition and Fees</u>.
- Submit the appropriate <u>Application</u> for enrollment.

4) Register for Course(s)

Register for your course(s) via Banner.

5) Complete Scholarship Program Application

View upcoming <u>application dates and access</u> the scholarship application.

If you meet the eligibility requirements, scholarship funds will be applied to your GVSU Student Account by the <u>tuition deadline</u> set by the university.

If you are **not eligible** for scholarship funds, you will be notified within two weeks of submitting your application.

6) Pay Remaining Tuition and Fees

You are responsible for paying, or setting up a payment plan trhough the Office of Financial Aid, for the tuition and fees not covered by your scholarship funds.

7) Successfully Complete Course(s)

If you drop or fail a course after receiving scholarship funds, your Student Account will be billed for the amount awarded, and you will be responsible for paying the balance.

8) Maintain Employment

If you do not maintain employment at your current school during the semester for which you receive scholarship funds, your Student Account could be billed for the amount awarded, and you could be responsible for paying the balance.
