Faculty Conference Travel Grant

Faculty Conference Travel Grants are designed to help defray the costs of attending teaching-related conferences. The use of funds does not require the presentation of papers at the conference.

Webinar Facilitation Grant

Webinar Facilitation Grants are designed to bring together a group of interested faculty to collectively view a live or recorded webinar and follow up with a group discussion. The format is a cost-effective onsite alternative to conference travel. The grant is awarded to a faculty member who agrees to facilitate the event. Funding covers the webinar registration fee and (optional) refreshments for the meeting.

Faculty Learning Community Participation Grant

Faculty Learning Community Participation Grants support faculty in engaging in an active, collaborative conversation and curriculum focused on a teaching and learning related topic of special interest or significance to faculty. Faculty Learning Community participants meet regularly throughout the semester and work together to apply the knowledge gained.

Sponsored Teaching and Learning Event Grant

Sponsored Teaching and Learning Event Grants support faculty attendance at specific teaching and learning related workshops, institutes, and conferences. Current sponsored events will be announced by the Pew FTLC throughout the academic year.

OLC Workshop Sponsored Grant

This grant supports faculty enrollment in online courses offered by the Online Learning Consortium (OLC). Courses related to digital learning and online/hybrid course design are offered throughout the year.

Teaching Innovation Grant

Teaching Innovation Grants are intended to support faculty in pursuing innovative projects that enhance teaching and learning. These projects range from cutting-edge, research-based teaching and learning innovations, to innovations that are new to one's field, to innovations that are new to the individual faculty member (i.e. active learning and engagement, classroom assessment, multi-disciplinary, inquiry-based, online/hybrid, collaborative, etc.). "Innovation" is considered in the context of the applicant's experience. Special consideration will be given to applications that align with current university teaching-related initiatives such as Strong Start, Community Engagement and Service Learning, Inclusion and Equity, Global Learning, Design Thinking, General Education, Contemplative Pedagogy, etc.

The intent of the Teaching Innovation Grant is to encourage new ideas; therefore, the Pew FTLC does not provide repeated support of a project, but rather encourages units/colleges to provide the continued support needed to sustain and enhance existing projects.

| Webinar Facilitation Grant \$500 | This grant is designed for faculty who facilitate a group webinar viewing and discussion on a specific teaching and learning related topic. It is an onsite alternative to conference travel. | Open Year Round | All faculty: full- or part-time | Webinar events must include a minimum of four faculty participants. | Applications will be accepted year round until funds are depleted. |
| Faculty Learning Community Participation Grant Funding will cover the cost of books/articles, supplies, food, etc. | This grant is available to faculty interested in joining a sponsored Faculty Learning Community focused on a topic of significance to faculty. Participants will engage in a 1-2 semester-long dialogue as well as work toward specific learning objectives and outcomes. | Applications will be accepted up to a week into the semester in which the FLC will begin or until groups are full. | All faculty: full- or part-time | Faculty Learning Communities must include a minimum of four faculty participants. | Formerly referred to as a "Teaching Circle". |
| Sponsored Teaching and Learning Event Grant Varies | This grant supports faculty attendance at <i>specific</i> teaching and learning related workshops, institutes and conferences. | Applications will have varied deadlines throughout the year which will be announced via a Pew FTLC mailing or invitation. | All faculty: full- or part-time Staff not eligible | Varies depending on the event. | Funds may cover the partial or full cost, depending on the event. See specific event for funding details. |
| OLC Workshop Sponsored Grant \$170 (Value: \$270) | This grant supports faculty enrollment in online courses offered by the Online Learning Consortium (OLC). Courses related to digital learning and online/hybrid course design are offered throughout the year. | Open Year Round | All faculty: full- or part-time Staff not eligible | Funding supports individual faculty course participation. | Applications will be accepted year round until funds are depleted. |
| Teaching Innovation Grant Level 1: \$500-\$3,000 Level 2: \$3,001-\$6000 (two applicants) Level 3: \$6,001-\$9000 (three applicants) | This grant is designed to support innovative projects that enhance teaching and learning. | Applications are due by midnight on October 15 and March 15. Grant activities must be completed within 18 months of the application date. | All faculty: full- or part-time Staff not eligible | Funding is available for 1-3 faculty applicants. If the Lead applicant is not tenure-track, a tenure-track or tenured faculty member must be identified to serve as a Faculty Sponsor for the grant activity. | Funding will cover the cost of personnel (non-GVSU or student), equipment, travel related to grant activity, facilities, registration fees, etc. |
