Highlighting the value of a liberal arts and sciences degree, the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS) is launching the CLAS Voyage for Fall 2025.

CLAS VOYAGE

The CLAS Voyage, centered in equity and sustainability, begins with an **academic seminar** connected with first-year experiences and resources:

- Students in every CLAS major will engage in experiential learning (e.g. internships, study abroad, scholarly and creative activity, and community-based learning).
- Students will **reflect on the experiences** they have and the skills they develop with a reflective toolkit, culminating with their **capstone**.

Faculty will be supported on the Voyage through the CLAS Center for Experiential Learning (CCEL). This hub of experiential and engaged learning will provide opportunities to develop experiential learning curriculum and opportunities, innovate with other faculty, and support grant-writing and other funding needs.



Internships play a critical role in shaping the future lives of GVSU students. Talent Link seeks to **enhance the value of a liberal arts and sciences degree** while meeting the needs of West Michigan employers through a unique employer-funded program.

Student scholars receive:

- \$15,000 employer-sponsored scholarship to layer a technical certificate (e.g. Project Management, Applied Data Analytics, Business Fundamentals or Technical Sales) on top of their major.
- Fall semester participation in a co-curricular cohort to prepare for the internship.
- Paid internship with an employer partner during winter or summer semester.
- Good faith job offer post-graduation if positions are available.

There are many opportunities to engage as faculty, including internship support and coordination, new certificate development, employer relations, and skill tracking and assessment.
