OER = Free + Permissions

Open Educational Resources (OER) are teaching and learning materials – often textbooks, but also lesson plans, assessments, and learning objects – which are **Open:** they are **free** to access, with **permissions** to modify, reuse, and share the materials.

OER can often be identified by a Creative Commons license¹: a standardized statement from the OER's creator, granting users the permission they need to modify, reuse, or share the work.

Why do OER matter?

Open Educational Resources:

- allow immediate access to course materials from the first day of classes
- can be customized and remixed to meet local needs or enable high-impact teaching
- support retention and student success by removing financial barriers
- empower faculty to share their scholarly teaching expertise with a global audience
- make education more accessible, more sustainable, more flexible, and more effective

Accelerating OER: Funding Opportunities for Fall 2023

- OER Review Stipend: \$200 for reviewing an OER in the Open Textbook Library
- OER Development Minigrant: \$500 for costs associated with an OER project
- Remix/Revise Stipend: \$1000 for adapting an OER or revising your own content
- Open Textbook Authoring Stipend: \$3000 for creating a new Open Textbook
- FTLC Sandbox Innovation Grant: \$500 for adapting a course to use OER
