A graduate of the Juilliard School and Yale University, Ravenna Helson has performed throughout the United States, Europe, Japan, and South America. In 1976, at age 16 she was privileged to be part of the Casals Chamber Music Festival in Puerto Rico.

As a baroque cellist and viola da gambist she has appeared with many groups including Ensemble Musical Offering in Milwaukee, Santa Fe Pro Musica, the Saint Louis Baroque Ensemble, and Comic Intermezzo in Chicago, performing in Early Music Festivals throughout the U.S. In NYC she was principal cellist of the New York City Opera National Company and played on Broadway. She has been a member of the New Jersey Symphony, the Detroit Symphony, the Milwaukee Symphony and is currently principal cellist of the Milwaukee Ballet Orchestra. She enjoys teaching chamber music in the Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra program where she also leads the MYSO Bach Ensemble and has been the cello instructor for their Progressions Program. She is the proud mother of two amazing daughters, Ari and Ahna.
