



WHY CONNECTION?

This activity allows groups to get to know each other better and see what similarities they may have. This is a fun proactive way to build relationships.

HOW?

Have students stand or sit in a circle. Ask the question and ask for a volunteer to go first. Hand the volunteer your talking piece. The first person to answer gets to decide which way to pass the talking piece around the circle.

ENERGIZERS





Birthday Line Up

Materials: Students

- This is a fun activity to get kids lined up and practice working together.
- The objective is to have students line up in order of their birthdays—January 1st through December 31st.
- To do this, they will need to know the order in which the months fall as well as their own birthday.
- They will also need to talk with one another in order to figure out who goes in front of whom.
- To make it super challenging, tell them they must do it without speaking at all, only using hand signals.
- For safety, you can have square pieces of paper on the floor that are 6 feet apart for students to line up on.



Materials: premade emoji plates

- This game shows kids how much they have in common with one another.
- Before the game begins, pass out the emoji auction plates. See the back side of this to see how to make.
- · Everyone sits at their desk or table.
- The teacher calls out a trait, such as curly hair or freckles, and everyone with that trait raises their paddle. Give students a few seconds to look around and take note. Play continues as above with teacher naming new traits.
- You could also give students a chance to call a trait.



Emoji Plates



- Glue the included emoji faces on to a paper plate.
- You can then glue the paper plate to a large popsicle stick.
- Make enough for each student to have one.
- You may want to laminate for durability.













Candy Corn Stack Up

Materials: Candy Corn

Directions:

- Give students a small cup of candy corn.
- · Set a timer for one minute.

Students race to see how many candy corn they can

stack in one minute.



Pumpkin Toss

Materials: Bag of candy pumpkins, two cups per team of two students

- · There are two students per team.
- · Have them stand 6 feet apart.
- The students will try to toss as many pumpkins into the cup their teammate is holding as they can in one minute.



WEELL SALES

ART REPRODUCTION PUZZLE

- Divide students into groups of six or eight (or larger if you want to make the task more difficult).
- Provide each team with an image and blank pieces of white card stock, one per team member. Use images included or any image you want.
- First, each team must cut up the image into the same number of pieces as there are group members.
- Then, each player will take one of the pieces of the image and reproduce it onto their blank piece of card stock with pencils, colored pencils, or markers. (If the team cuts the image into irregularly shaped pieces, each team member must then cut their blank paper into the same shape).
- When every team has created the pieces of their puzzle, they will switch pieces with another team. The team will work together to solve the puzzle.









HOT SEAT



- This fun game is a lot like the game show Password.
- Split your class into two teams and have them sit together in teams facing the white board or chalk board.
- Then take an empty chair—one for each team—and put it at the front of the class, facing the team members. These chairs are the "hot seats."
- Choose one volunteer from each team to come up and sit in the "hot seat," facing their teammates with their back to the board.
- Prepare a list of vocabulary words (or use words included) to use for the game.
- Choose one and write it clearly on the board.
- Each team will take turns trying to get their teammate in the hot seat to guess the word, using synonyms, antonyms, definitions, etc.
- Make sure team members work together so that each member has a chance to provide clues. The student in the hot seat listens to their teammates and tries to guess the word.
- The first hot seat student to say the word wins a point for their team.
- Once the word is successfully guessed, a new student from each team sits in the hot seat, and a new round begins with a different word.

PUMPKIN TIC TAC TOE



Materials:

- 10 mini pumpkins (5 orange and 5 white)
- Orange duct tape (or any color tape)


- Create a tic tac toe board out of wasabi or painters tape on a table.
- Students use the pumpkins as tic tac toe pieces.
- Separate group into two teams.
- Teams stand in a line and take turns playing a pumpkin onto the tic tac toe board.

HALLOWEEN JENGA

Preparation:

- Cut out the Halloween themed questions and actions
- Glue onto Jenga blocks, if you are able to

- Follow the regular rules of Jenga.
- When a player pulls out a block with an action or question, they must perform or answer whatever the request.
- If you don't have Jenga blocks, you could just fold these squares and have students take turns drawing one.






