- i. Yumi Jakobcic, GVSU Office of Sustainability
 - i. Small staff over in Lake Michigan Hall, I am the campus coordinator, so I communicate with the students mostly. Our office is like a firm/hub where students can get more information on how to live a more sustainable, like food, transpiration, waste, etc.
 - ii. We do events throughout the year, like sustainability week. The "Stars" program, is what can be used for ranking by Princeton,
 - iii. We usually land in top 50 in the nation, number 1 in the state, etc.
 - iv. Focusing on trying to engage more with students who are in their first couple of years here at GVSU. We even offer a 1 credit class on how to be sustainable.
 - v. ASSU, they picked our far as best sustainable farm, encourage people to come out and see the internship opportunities that we provide. Our farm is great for all routes of different types of educations.
 - vi. Opportunities, Sustainable reinvestment fund, open to students, faculty and staff, funds available for people for trying to improve sustainable aspects of campus life.
 - vii. Campus sustainability advisory councils, sustainable reinvestment fund are two places where senate can get involved if interested in being part of these committees.
 - viii. Places where you might want to see us do better, or wanting to collaborate, reach out to us as we want to partner with student senators and other students alike.
 - ix. Also we are looking into the amount of recycling we do, in terms of trying to reduce the amount we "throw away"

- ii. Jodi Chycinski, Admissions
 - i. Updates on enrolment from past fall
 - ii. Entering freshman fall class, 2nd large test in GVSU history, no compromises in quality, in fact credentials for admission are slightly harder, 86% of freshmen live on campus, 9% are in the honors college, out of state 441 students for freshman, higher than last year by 31 students. 11% overall are non Michigan residents, 29 states represented and 26 countries, Kent Ottawa and Muskegon, make up 25%, East side of state makes up 28%.
 - iii. Rockford, Hudsonville, Clarkston, Grand Haven, Lake Orien, Wild Lake Northern, Grandville, Allie Stevenson and East Kentwood High school are some of the top high schools that come here.
 - iv. June July August and September, over 3000 unique visitors coming to admission office to learn more about GVSU. This number does not include their family members, but potential students alone.
 - v. New space, 112 seating space for greeting guests. Feels very branded as GVSU.
 - vi. Also able to host high school groups, we do as much and often as we can, sometimes we even reach our to high schools to host events here. Looking to last year, we hosted 93 high schools, over 2000 students hosted in high school.
 - vii. Continuing to host larger guest events, benefit is being able to put faculty in front of possible students. Over 1000 possible students came to our larger guest events.
 - viii. We need more help on volunteers, we have student employees, but due to sheer volume of number of guests, we need more volunteers to accommodate our large numbers for people touring, April 5th and April 12th are very busy days that we need people to help tour the campus. We appreciate the tour so much, almost all tours are given by student volunteers, so we are so grateful for their help. Our students are our best speakers for telling potential students.
 - ix. 628 more students have visited campus this year at this time compared to last year. Best recruiting tool is word of mouth.
 - x. Feedback from families is that they think highly of GVSU and love the student volunteers

- xx. Can't remember off the top of my head but we have student from all counties of the state except for one in the UP. We compete with MSU the most for applications

- xxiv. 15% decrease in the past 5 years, but we have been able to maintain and grow our admission numbers due to the quality of our institution. We have hundreds of strategies that are there to recruit people from all over.
