5. Business

- a. Restructuring Omnibus Bill
 - i. Proctor: I am going to read this bill and we can discuss this after.
 - Recognizing, the Grand Valley State University Student Senate has been on a steady decline in both membership and engagement from students over the past several years; and
 - Whereas, this disruption of the typical longevity of members has resulted in fewer students eligible and prepared to serve in leadership roles; and
 - Recognizing, that all members of the Student Senate are students first and foremost, and a student also needs to prioritize their academics and personal well-being; and
 - 4. Whereas, there are considerable time commitments that coincide with serving on Student Senate, which cause barriers for students seeking to join or run for Cabinet positions; and
 - Recognizing, the Student Senate has a responsibility to represent all students and their diverse and ever-changing needs; and
 - 6. **Recognizing,** the Student Senate needs to adapt as the student experience changes; and
 - 7. Whereas, adjustments made to the existing functions and structure during the Constitutional Task Force meetings in previous years have made improvements, but they have not sufficiently addressed the problems facing Student Senate;
 - 8. Therefore, Let it Be Resolved, the Grand Valley State University Student Senate will completely restructure itself in order to broaden our representation to increase student perspectives; to increase our visibility and engagement with the student body; to improve our reputation and prestige on campus; to enrich the overall experience for Student Senators, Cabinet members, and the student body; and to implement the best practices to maintain a sustainable Student Senate and student body.

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- 9. Furthermore, Let it Be Resolved, the restructured Student Senate will reflect the proposals outlined below, and these proposals will serve as the framework for what will be implemented into the Student Senate governing documents.
- ii. DeVries: This is not an objection, but I know some people are opposed to DEI does anyone think it could be a problem in the future?
- iii. Johnson IV: I want to go back to our values, is initiative defined as a value?
- iv. Proctor: The intention is that senators are taking initiative to do their projects and I want you all to think about what initiative means to you.
- v. VanDyke: It means we take on the problems that people have that the school doesnt solve for the students.
- vi. Burns: Maybe add taking?
- vii. Hallead: I like that, but we already had this conversation.
- viii. Bashore: Is this ranking our values or just a list?
- ix. Proctor: Just a list.
- x. Bates: I like it but I think we should do "Taking Initiative"
- xi. Martinez: I like the one word and if we add taking itt takes away from the format of how we had it listed.
- xii. Bashore: If we have the student body read this, they might not know what we are talking about.
- xiii. Bartlett: We could replace it with "Advancement"
- xiv. Johnson IV: Dynamism, I think this is more oriented towards us.
- xv. Hallead: Do you think people will know what that means?
- xvi. Proctor: At the university level I think DEI is the term. Thnak you for the question, Senator DeVries.
- xvii. Stang: I am not sold on initiative, maybe an option to not have it.
- xviii. Bennett: We are meant to make change, to have initiative, we will have students come to us knowing we can make a change.
- xix. Proctor: Okay, advancement, dynamism?
- xx. Proctor: Okay, for the straw poll, there will be a few options here, leave it the way it is. Option 2, add "Taking" in front of it, 3, "Advancement", Option 4 was "Dynamism", Option 5 is removing it from the list.
