 - A. Siegrist provides brief overview at this phase of the Steering Committee, the focus is to get student input, such as through the student huddles students must be registered by December 4th; trying to get as many resources as they can to get input for the GV visions statement
 - B. Dean Mark Schaub, one of the leads for the Steering Committee, speaks there are two opportunities for student input for virtual sessions, there is a website (Reach Higher 2025) where people can fill out a form or email the committee with comments

 - A. Appointment of Annie Biggs to the Senate Resources Committee
 - i. Thompson provides rationale, citing Biggs' fresh perspective, her interest in building a healthy and productive community. Thompson motions to appoint Biggs to SRC
 - a) Gineman seconds the motion.
 - b) Biggs is appointed to SRC
 - B. Discussion and Voting on F-20-03: Urge Grand Valley State University to Forgo a Tuition Increase for the Academic Year 2021-2022 Siegrist
 - i. Siegrist shares resolution and provides a brief overview: it has sat on the body for two weeks, essentially urging GVSU to forgo a tuition increase for the academic year of 2021-2022. Siegrist provides statistics within GV and in peer institutions, and recognizes a petition organized by a member of the student body with a similar notion for Fall 2020
 - ii. Discussion
 - a) McMahon and Neal voice their support, Neal emphasizing the importance of understanding that not everyone receives financial aid
 - b) Thompson feels this is a good example of what Student Senate is meant to do, fully supports the resolution
 - iii. Voting
 - a) Motion passes 36 yays, and 1 abstention
 - C. Discussion and Voting on F-20-04: Formally Reinstate Battle of the Valleys as an Inter-University Competition between Grand Valley State University and Saginaw Valley State University - Pagel
 - i. Pagel provides brief overview and rationale: in summary, it is a formal reinstatement of Battle of the Valleys philanthropic competition with the addition of rules agreement between the two universities and a healthier, more organized competition while also addressing the concerns that led to retreating from BoV in the first place
 - ii. Discussion

- a) Dowker was one of the voters in support of ending the original BoV,
 but is in support of it now given all the work and improvements that have been made
- b) Moine and Samuels offer their support
- Siegrist shares that Pagel worked hard on this resolution and attended the meeting with SVSU when this topic was discussed and notes that SVSU was very enthusiastic

- a) Motion passes with 33 yays, 1 nay, and 1 abstention
