**A RESOLUTION TO: Align the Credit/No Credit deadline at Grand Valley State University with the seventy-five percent (75%) tuition refund deadline.**

---

**Recognizing**, the current Credit/No Credit (C/NC) deadline at Grand Valley State University is on the fifth (5) day of class<sup>1</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, a maximum of ten (10) semester hours of major, minor, or cognate courses within the major may be taken on a Credit/No Credit basis only with the consent of the student's major department<sup>2</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, a maximum of twenty-five (25) percent of a student's hours of Grand Valley courses earned to fulfill graduation requirements may be taken on a Credit/No Credit basis<sup>3</sup>; and

**Whereas**, the fifth (5) day of class is typically the first Friday of the semester, before many classes have become fully engaged with course material; and

**Whereas**, an extension of three (3) weeks will align the Credit/No Credit deadline with the seventy-five (75) percent tuition refund deadline; and

**Recognizing**, Grand Valley State Universities 2020 temporary policy allotting a second time-window for students to choose Credit/No Credit for classes, due to extenuating circumstances<sup>4</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, Wayne State University’s Credit/No Credit deadline is on the thirtieth (30) calendar day following the first day of class<sup>5</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, Michigan State University’s Credit/No Credit deadline is on the middle of semester date marked by the Michigan State University Office of the Registrar<sup>6</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, Grand Valley State University’s Credit/No Credit deadline is earlier in contrast to sister institutions in Michigan, which are providing students with increased flexibility; and

**Recognizing**, a Reach Higher 2025 strategy stating “Increasing flexibility for students in terms of pace and engagement with curricular components...”<sup>7</sup>; and

**Recognizing**, the previous student use of the Credit/No Credit opportunity is as follows: twenty-four (24) approved requests in Fall 2021, thirty-eight (38) approved requests in Winter 2022, and fourteen (14) approved requests in Fall 2022; and<sup>8</sup>

**Whereas**, providing more time for students to submit requests, the number of students who use of the Credit/No Credit opportunity will likely rise; and

**Whereas**, increasing flexibility and allotting more time for a decision will support students and their ever changing needs during their academic career at Grand Valley State University;

**Therefore, Let It Be Resolved**, that the Grand Valley State University Student Senate, acting on behalf of the student body, recommends that Grand Valley State University extends the Credit/No Credit to align with the seventy-five percent (75%) tuition refund deadline.
