III. Guest Speakers

- a. Reaching Higher 2025 Updated Strategic Plan Presentation: Mark Schaub, Janet Winter, and Tara Bivens
 - i. Schaub: is thankful for the invitation to join again today. They visited the student senate in the fall in person with what they thought was a great plan that they worked hard on. They got an endorsement from the Student Senate. On October 1st, 2021 the University Academic Senate voted to not endorse Reaching Higher 2025. President Mantella gave them a few additional months to make changes and that is what they are presenting today.
 - ii. President Mantella has held around a dozen leadership conversations with faculty and staff and will be holding sessions with students soon to gather input.
 - iii. They added 4 new faculty members to the steering committee and replaced student vacancies.
 - iv. They kept the values statements unchanged. They focused on the many pages of input from UAS while still balancing what they heard from all campus communities. They made significant changes to the website, and added land recognition.
 - v. The mission statement: took the second sentence from the 2016-2021 mission statement.
 - vi. Vision statement: expanded and detailed to emphasize the integration of liberal and professional education, specified who "we" are, added the word student to complement the use of "learner", and removed the unpopular word "unmatched."

- vii. Empowered educational experience: worked to center student agency and tried to conceptualize and articulate that concept, added bullet points that point to some of the specific ways the strategy will be enacted without too many tactics, eliminated the phrase "high touch," deleted the "marketing language," emphasized the role of talented faculty by specifically naming their important leadership role
- viii. Lifelong learning: added bullet points with more details, specifically emphasized continued dedication to "traditional-aged FTIAC student population," emphasized the importance of enrolled students in fostering the principles of a lifetime of learning, eliminated "entrepreneurial" as a goal for student behavior, and deleted the "marketing" language
- ix. Educational Equity: provided bullet-pointed specifics, emphasized the connection between the well-being of people to the well-being of the world and communities, and changed "impatiently" to "urgently."
- x. Can view the two versions of the website to see the changes that have been made
- xi. Biermacher: thinks marketing could still be important as GVSU is trying to grow as a university. Is there any way they could promote the university in a more obvious way?
 - (1) Schaub: they could, but it is not the goal of this document. There are professionals who handle the marketing for the university and they will not stop their work. This will serve as their guidebook so GVSU is not represented as something they are not
- xii. Krichevsky: thanks them for coming, expresses that she is very happy to see the growth and all of the hard work that has went into these changes to make it look so great
- xiii. Rusch: thanks them for coming, what are strategies along with education to create these "globally minded citizens?"
 - (1) Winter: strategies give way to show that there is a lot of room for innovation and creativity to what global minded means. There are many different lenses to look through. It is broad enough for every department to decide what this means to them. Things such as study abroad and focusing on sustainability
 - (2) Rusch: how can GVSU portray that they are a community that does a lot more than just education?
 - (3) Winter: In her opinion education goes further than just classes. The Student Senate is providing education even though they are not receiving credit for being a part of it. Most experiences at GVSU provide opportunities for education

- b. Cook Leadership Academy: Grace Tummel and Abigail Sachs
 - i. Tummel: assistant director at the Hauenstein Center
 - ii. Sachs: program director for cook leadership academy
 - iii. Sachs: recruitment for next year for the Cook Leadership academy is in full swing. There are 30 minute virtual information sessions scheduled for 1/18, 2/2 and 2/17 at 5:00pm to get more information and ask questions
 - iv. Tummel: it is a full year commitment to develop yourself and your leadership skills.
 - v. Kidd: how much time should be dedicated to the application?
 - (1) Tummel: recommends that you look at the application and put the 8 short essay questions in a word document to give yourself time to reflect before you answer them on the application. It depends on yourself and how fast you crank out writing
 - vi. Frappier: thanks them for coming, is there an interview process following the application?
 - (1) Sachs: about 2 weeks after the application closes they will send out invitations for interviews and you will be interviewed by a panel. It is a single interview and decisions are made before the end of the academic year
 - vii. Matthews: What are some of the ways the leadership academy develops the person and is it open to all majors?
 - (1) Sachs: over 40 majors represented currently, encourage all majors. They host workshops that allow for self reflection, and you have an opportunity to be mentored 1:1 by someone that is currently in your desired field.
 - (2) Tummel: they hear the biggest impact is relationships. You meet with the same students every time and it allows you to meet people you maybe wouldn't meet on your own.
 - viii. Bucon: Can you share your emails to contact you with more questions?
