- a. DEI Training: Marlene Kowalski-Braun
  - i. Marlene Kowalski-Braun had a medical emergency, DEI training will be rescheduled to next semester.
- b. Student Affairs Semester Update Vice Provost of Student Affairs: Aaron Haight
  - i. Division of Student Affairs places students at the center of their work, with staff ready to partner with students.
  - ii. January will be 2 years ago since conversations started about COVID and now it is two years later and everyone is still trying to figure out a new normal. They have mastered the ability to adapt, innovate, and collaborate to support students. They have to take the last two years into consideration when going forward, maybe that means mixing old and new practices.
  - iii. Rec and wellness: implemented virtual programs, club sports have returned, more IM options. Hired a new esports director and created a new esports room, fascinating and exciting thing.
  - iv. Children's enrichment center: stayed open the whole time and continued to provide childcare for those who needed it. Obtained grant funding and were able to give additional discounts to students for childcare. The state provided funding for bonuses for all childcare workers.
  - v. Student health: hired a student health promotions coordinator a few years ago. Currently in conversations about the healthcare that is provided for students. Will be transitioning health center providers this summer that has a focus on college students.

- vi. Office of student life: exciting things like campus life night returned. New assistant director of sorority and fraternity life has been hired and is starting next week.
- vii. University counseling: did a great job during the shutdown. Offer group and 1:1 therapy, workshops, and many other great resources. Partnering with an external organization to provide true 24/7 care for students. Proud of work they've done for diversity, equity, and inclusion. Added staff and resources for students of color.
- viii. Student conduct: new director started in October- he is a GVSU alumni and 2 time student senate president. Implemented a new statement of student rights and responsibilities. Continue to implement restorative practices. Noticed an increase in academic integrity violations with online classes. Focusing on how they can be proactive in letting students know what academic integrity is.
- ix. Dean of Students Office: CARE support system continues to be used. Doing quarantine outreach. Implemented a second year newsletter this year for the students who did not get the Grand Valley experience last year. Higher open rate for second year newsletter than first year newsletter.
- x. UFC: really great meetings. 4 subgroups focusing on 4 different items of action. Groups are gathering data and will put together recommendations no later than March.
- xi. Housing and residence life: more engagement opportunities this year. New learning and living communities downtown, working on expanding these.
- xii. Announcement of new VP of student affairs coming soon, very exciting. Each candidate had different strengths and different things to offer.
