SCI 495: Teaching Science in the 21st Century OR

SST 495: Education in Plural Societies [Capstone] (3 credits) OR/AND

MTH 386: Study Abroad (3 Credits)

Honors students: can be used to fulfill HNR 300, HNR 401, or HNR 499 requirements.

Fulfills General Education Global Perspectives requirement.
Fulfills entire General Education Issues requirement (Students must take 2 courses from 2 different disciplines). Reflection required.
Language of instruction: English

Excursions & Highlights

- Teach 50-60 hours in a Tanzanian classroom, volunteer at a local orphanage, many opportunities to interact with locals, and learn basic Swahili
- Field trips include a 4 day-safari, a day climb on Mt. Kilimanjaro, tour a coffee
 plantation, shopping in the local Maasai market, design and have made clothing or
 accessories from local fabric
- Build intercultural teaching and communication skills
