Students will register for a total of 3-6 credits:

MTH 496: Senior Thesis [Capstone] (3 Credits)

Non-math majors may substitute this course upon approval from their home department and the Tanzania program director. OR

SAT 495: Teaching Sciences & Arts in the Elementary Classrooms [Capstone] (3 credits) OR

SCI 495: Teaching Science in the 21st Century OR

SST 495: Education in Plural Societies [Capstone] (3 credits) OR/AND

MTH 386: Study Abroad (3 Credits)

Fulfills General Education Global Perspectives requirement.

Fulfills entire General Education Issues requirement (Students must take 2 courses from 2 different disciplines). Reflection required.

Language of instruction: English

- Teach 50-60 hours in a Tanzanian classroom, volunteer at a local orphanage, many opportunities to interact with locals, and learn basic Swahili
- Field trips include a 4 day-safari, a day climb on Mt. Kilimanjaro, Arusha National Park and a weekend in a local village
- Build intercultural teaching and communication skills
