<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Students who self-place into WRT 120 should take this course in the fall semester and then take WRT 130 in the winter semester of their first year. Students who self-place into WRT 150 should take the course in the fall semester. Students will not need to take WRT 150 if they have earned credit for the course through AP/Dual Enrollment. A grade of C or better is required in WRT 130 or 150 in order to satisfy the WRT requirement at GVSU.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>Students who opt for the WRT 120/130 stretch writing sequence should plan to take PSY 301 during the spring/summer semester between first and second year of the program. Honors College students do not take WRT 150, 120, or 130 as their sequence covers this requirement.

<sup>3</sup> Honors College students should talk with their Honors and CLAS Advisors about program requirement overlaps. \*\* HNR 201 will cover HST 209, EDF 115 will cover HNR 300, and the Honors freshman sequence will count as the concentration option for PCKET students in the Honors program

<sup>4</sup> Classes with an asterisk \* and that are underlined should be taken in the suggested semester in order to stay on track for Apprenticeship in the fourth year.

**Degree Requirements -** PK-3 students can pursue a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. Students who wish to obtain a BA must fulfill 3<sup>rd</sup> semester proficiency in a foreign language (201 level). The BS requirements are incorporated into the major requirements.

These 10 weeks follow 10 weeks of general classroom internship, extending the semester by 5 weeks. Therefore, EDI 470 must occur in the winter semester only. To be certified to teach ESL, students must have two semesters of a Foreign Language Requirement. This can be through language placement or though taking two semesters of the language.

## Additional Advising Notes:

- To be certified to teach elementary grades Pre-K through 3, students must complete a double major in PCKET and Educational Studies. The Concentration and Specialization Areas are optional.
- If students choose not to complete 3-6 in addition to Pre-K-3 (see point above), they are strongly encouraged to add at least one concentration to increase marketability.
- Students are also encouraged to consider one of the optional specializations, again to increase marketability.
- Students earning a teaching credential in special education will complete either the PK-3 or 3-6 with specialized teaching
  endorsement major and a special education major. Students declaring a specialization of Special Education or ESL are
  not required to complete the concentration for 3-6.

- 1. Declare the desired PCKET major/concentration
- 2. Declare the Educational Studies 2<sup>nd</sup> major/concentration that applies to the PCKET major:
  - a. Educational Studies Pre-K-3<sup>rd</sup> Grade for students choosing PCKET PK-3 or PCKET PK-6
  - b. Educational Studies 3<sup>rd</sup>-6th Grades for students choosing PCKET 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>
