Andrés Chávez was raised in the farm worker movement founded by his grandfather, the late labor leader and civil rights activist - César Chávez. Andrés is the youngest son of Socorro and Paul Chávez. He grew up participating in social justice activities such as rallies, picket lines, demonstrations, union conventions and political campaigns, including those for immigration reform. Andrés is a senior at California State University, Bakersfield, majoring in public policy and administration. Currently, he works at the HEP and CAMP, educational programs which serve students from migrant or seasonal farmworker families.

Andrés will speak about the life and legacy of his grandfather and the plight of farm workers then and transition to how Latinx millennials can be the voice of change in this 21st century. Following his talk is a meet and greet reception with light hors d'oeuvres.
