STEM Master Teacher Fellowship

Application open: August 5 – October 18, 2019



The fellowship provides an opportunity for a K-12 STEM teacher to work remotely with the National Museum of African American History and Culture staff throughout the 2019-2020 school year, and onsite for the selected teacher's spring break, and a two-month period during the summer in Washington, DC. The NMAAHC STEM Master Teacher Fellow will be an integral member of the NMAAHC Education team as they assist in providing professional development workshops and virtual content to K-12 STEM teachers across the nation.

The selected teacher will:

- ▶ Conduct research using the Smithsonian collections to expand understanding of the role African Americans have played in STEM and invention
- ▶ Develop experiential professional development opportunities for K-12 educators
- ▶ Plan and provide a week-long professional development workshop for K-12 educators
- ▶ Provide educational guidance and assistance for additional programs and materials as needed
